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## **Session Details**



Shifting the Mindset: Taking an Assets-based Approach - Learn about the dangers of deficit thinking, the myth of saviorism, and taking a different approach to at-promise student education.



Educational Reform for Black Youth: Dr. Bettina Love - Dr. Love will discuss the ideas from her most recent research around past reform efforts and how to better serve Black students.



Meeting the Needs of At-Promise Youth: Workshops centered around improving as a leader in equity work within school sites and districts.



Facilitated Team Time: A half day, facilitated planning session for site and/or district teams to determine how they will put new learning into action. Improvement science materials will be provided during facilitation to support the work.



Culturally Sustaining Spaces: Sites will bring students to the session and engage in culturally sustaining spaces with those students. The day will center around student genius and joy. The afternoon will feature a surprise guest speaker and a student panel.
